The aims of Christian Community Schooling

The broad aims of Christian Community Schooling are:

- a) To provide an education of high academic standards that is based on:
 - i) an acceptance of the Lordship of Christ; and
 - ii) an acceptance of the bible as the revealed Word of God; as these are defined in the Confession of Faith of the Association/School.

- b) To provide an education that also:
 - i) fosters self-discipline in the learner while teaching him to accept the discipline of the Church which is the Body of Christ and to obey the laws of the Government,
 - ii) develops the individuality of the learner and stresses the function of the learner as a member of the Body of Christ, and of the Community,
 - iii) trains the learner in the moral and ethical standards of the Bible as interpreted in the teaching of the New Testament,
 - iv) develops the learner's creative and critical abilities, and
 - v) stresses co-operation rather than competition and fosters the development of the gifts, skills and abilities of the learner for the service for Jesus Christ in the body of Christ and the community.

Confession of Faith

The Confession of Faith of Coast Christian School is as follows:

We believe:

- The Bible is God's Word, inspired by Holy Spirit and without error. It is our sole authority and binding in all matters of faith and conduct.
- There is one holy God, existing eternally Father, Son and Holy Spirit. He is the Creator of all things. Jesus Christ is the Son of God who became man through conception by the Holy Spirit and virgin birth and was without sin.
- The Holy Spirit convicts the world of guilt in regard to sin, righteousness and judgement.
- Satan is the originator of evil and through him sin was introduced into the world after the fall of Adam and Eve. Man is by nature and practice a sinful creature and is unable, by any personal merit or works, to meet the standards of God.
- In love, Jesus Christ voluntarily suffered the penalty of death by crucifixion for the sin of the whole world. He was buried and arose from among the dead on the third day. He is now seated at the right hand of God. By personal faith in Christ one can know the forgiveness of sins, be reconciled to God, become a member of God's family and receive eternal life. Those who do not accept Jesus Christ as Saviour will be separated from God eternally.
- Christ lives in every Christian's life by the Holy Spirit from the moment he is born again into God's family. The Holy Spirit guides, instructs and empowers the believer for godly living and service.
- The Lord Jesus Christ will return in person to receive all believers to himself and to set up his Kingdom. At that time all believers will be united with Him eternally. Then there will be a new heaven and a new earth in which God's sovereignty will be unchallenged.
